Lynch, Chris

Teens D.J. and Russell, life-long friends and neighbors, had drifted apart. When their firefighter fathers are both killed, they try to help one another come to terms with the tragedy and its aftermath.

McBride, Kristina One Moment

High school senior Maggie remembers little about the accidental death of her boyfriend, Joey, but as she slowly begins to recall that day at the gorge with their long-time friends, she realizes he was keeping some terrible secrets.

McGovern, Cammie Say What You Will

A girl confined to a wheelchair by cerebral palsy and a boy with an obsessive-compulsive disorder are assigned to spend time together in what becomes a blossoming friendship that neither expected.

Moldover, Joseph Every Moment After

After high school graduation, best friends Matt and Cole strive to put behind them the school shooting they survived in first grade and really begin to live.

Myracle, Lauren Shine

When her best friend falls victim to a vicious hate crime, sixteen-year-old Cat sets out to discover the culprits in her small North Carolina town.

Reed, Amy The Boy and Girl Who Broke the World

In the near future, seniors Lydia and Billy form an unlikely friendship when their high schools are merged, bonding over their Washington town's weird history and their unusual families.

Reed, Jaime Sorry Not Sorry

When her ex-best friend Alyssa discovers that she is in urgent need of a kidney transplant as a result of acute renal failure due to juvenile diabetes, Janelle must decide how far a former friendship requires her to go.

Ribay, Randy After the Shot Drops

Told from alternating perspectives, Bunny takes a basketball scholarship to an elite private school to help his family, leaving behind Nasir, his best friend, in their tough Philadelphia neighborhood.

See, Lisa Snow Flower and the Secret Fan

A story of friendship set in nineteenth-century China follows an elderly woman and her companion as they communicate their hopes, dreams, joys, and tragedies through a unique secret language.

Sher, Abby Miss You Love You Hate You Bye

For most of her life, Hannah has idolized her best friend, Zoe: "Zoe was the sun, and I would gladly orbit her in whichever direction she chose." But now, just before their junior year, Hannah (whom Zoe has nicknamed "Hank") is shocked to see how much Zoe has changed. In the wake of her parents' breakup, Zoe has lost weight-a lot of weight-and obsessively attends exercise classes with her mom. She's pursuing internet fame via videos co-starring her new cat, but the scratches on her arms don't look feline to Hank. Hank tries to look past Zoe's unhealthy behaviors, but when she can no longer deny that Zoe is sick, she risks their friendship to get her the help she needs.

Sonnenblick, Jordan Notes from the Midnight Driver

After being assigned to perform community service at a nursing home, sixteen-year-old Alex befriends a cantankerous old man who has some lessons to impart about jazz guitar playing, love, and forgiveness.

Stone, Nic Dear Justyce

Incarcerated teen Quan Banks writes letters to Justyce McCallister, with whom he bonded years before over family issues, about his experiences in the American juvenile justice system.

Thomas, Leah Because You'll Never Meet Me (and sequel)

Ollie, who has seizures when near electricity, lives in a backwoods cabin with his mother and rarely sees other people. Moritz, born with no eyes and a heart defect that requires a pacemaker, is bullied at his high school. When a physician who knows both suggests they begin corresponding, they form a strong bond that may get them through dark times.

Watson, Sarah Most Likely

Four friends--Ava, CJ, Jordan, and Martha--who have been tight since kindergarten are entering their senior year and beginning to face the realization that they will all be going in different directions. The opening chapter establishes that one will become President of the United States, but readers don't know which one. Is it Ava, an artist who is struggling with her future choices; CJ, an earnest do-gooder; Jordan, a budding ace journalist; or Martha, a strong young woman who is facing some hurdles in life? As the novel spans a year of their experiences, a red herring is thrown in to muddy the waters as to who the future president could be.

Whaley, John Corey Highly Illogical Behavior

Agoraphobic sixteen-year-old Solomon has not left his house in three years, but Lisa is determined to change that--and to write a scholarship-winning essay based on the results.

Yang, Andrew I'm Not Here to Make Friends

When Sabine Zhang is picked for Hotel California, a teen reality show with an all-Asian cast, she jumps at the opportunity. As one of few Asians at her high school in the Midwest, she's always felt as if she was playing a side character in someone else's story. But on this show, she'll finally have a chance to step into the spotlight. All Yoona Bae wants is to get away. The girls at church think she's mean, her mom thinks she's a troublemaker, and she's tired of fighting against her unearned bad reputation. So when she's invited to appear on Hotel California, Yoona sees it as an opportunity to chill out and make some friends--but life on the show isn't all sunshine and self-actualization. The producers want drama at all costs, even if it means pitting Sabine and Yoona against each other.
