Barnard, Sara A Quiet Kind of Thunder

Steffi has been a selective mute for most of her life –she's been silent for so long that she feels completely invisible. But Rhys, the new boy at school, sees her. When Trixie dies, her brother and her best friend, who are falling in love, struggle with grief and guilt which threatens their fledgling romance.

Blackman, Malorie Naughts & Crosses

In a world where the pale-skinned Naughts are discriminated against by the politically and socially powerful dark-skinned Crosses, teenagers Callum--a Naught--and Sephy--a Cross--test whether their love is strong enough to survive their society's racism.

Blake, Ashley Herring Suffer Love

Hadley St. Clair and Sam Bennett are teenagers caught up in the grip of their mutual attraction--but adultery, family secrets, and betrayal threaten to drive them apart.

Caletti, Deb The Nature of Jade

Seattle high school senior Jade's life is defined by her anxiety disorder and dysfunctional family, until she spies a mysterious boy with a baby who seems to share her fascination with the elephants at a nearby zoo.

Caletti, Deb The Story of Us

After jilting two previous fiances, Cricket's mother is finally marrying the right man. As wedding attendees arrive for a week of festivities, however, complications arise for Cricket involving her own love life, her beloved dog Jupiter, and her mother's reluctance to marry.

Cameron, Sharon Rook

Han, Jenny To All the Boys I've Loved Before

Lara Jean writes love letters to all the boys she has loved and then hides them in a hatbox—until one day those letters are accidentally sent.

Hand, Cynthia Unearthly (and sequels)

Sixteen-year-old Clara Gardner's purpose as an angel-blood begins to manifest itself, forcing her family to pull up stakes and move to Jackson, Wyoming, where she learns that danger and heartbreak come with her powers.

Harris, Rachel Eyes on Me

Look up the word "nerd" and you'll find Lily Bailey's picture. She has one goal: first stop valedictorian, next stop Harvard--until a stint in the hospital from too much stress lands her in the last place a klutz like her ever expected to be: salsa dance lessons. Lord, Emma Tweet Cute

Meet Pepper, swim team captain, chronic overachiever, and all-around perfectionist. Her family may be falling apart, but their massive fast-food chain is booming--mainly thanks to Pepper, who is barely managing to juggle real life while secretly running Big League Burger's massive Twitter account. Enter Jack, class clown and constant thorn in Pepper's side. His relationship with the business that holds his future—his family's deli—might be love/hate, but when Big League Burger steals his grandma's iconic grilled cheese recipe, he'll do whatever it takes to take them down, one tweet at a time.

Mafi, Tahereh A Very Large Expanse of Sea

It's 2002, a year after 9/11. It's an extremely turbulent time politically, but especially so for someone like Shirin, a sixteen-year-old Muslim girl who's tired of being stereotyped. Shirin is never surprised by how horrible people can be. Mangle, Bethany All the Right Reasons

When Cara accidentally posts a rant about her father and his new wife online, it goes viral-- and catches the attention of the TV producers behind a new reality dating show for single parent families. Now Cara and her mother have been whisked away to sunny Key West where they're asked to narrow a field of suitors and their kids down to one winning pair. It's outside Cara's comfort zone, and soon she and her mother are clashing on which suitors are worth keeping around. As the son of a contestant, Connor is decidedly off-limits... except she can't get him out of her head. Maybe there's a reason most people don't date on TV.

Marquardt, Marie Flight Season
