

## MTHS ONLINE SUBSCRIPTION DATABASES

Our subscription databases include reference book articles, newspaper articles, magazine articles, and more. Both Google and our databases use the same network (the Internet) to access files. Unlike free-web sites found by using Google, however, what is in a subscription database is not accessible to everyone—the school pays yearly fees for you to have the right to use them. Logins and passwords are required when you use these databases outside of school.

***American History Online***—articles covering more than 500 years of American political, military, social, and cultural history.

***Ancient and Medieval History Online***—explores the pre-modern world (to the mid-15<sup>th</sup> century) with in-depth focus on Egypt, Mesopotamia, Greece, Rome, Africa, Europe, the Americas, and Asia.

***Britannica Image Quest***—millions of rights-cleared images from more than 50 image collections.

***Britannica School***—basic encyclopedia (with three reading levels for many of the articles).

***Classroom Video on Demand***—streaming video subscription service providing access to thousands of educational videos.

***CQ Researcher Online***—database of single-themed, 1,200-word reports on health, social trends, criminal justice, international affairs, education, the environment, technology, and the economy. Articles date back to 1923 (giving an historical perspective for many topics).

***Current Biography Illustrated***—biographical articles and images—there are no articles in this database for people who died before 1940.

***Ferguson's Career Guidance Center***—detailed information on more than 3,300 jobs.

***Gale Virtual Reference Library***—this is an online extension of our reference collection—an ebook collection of reference books that belong to our library but can be accessed only online.

***Issues and Controversies***—hundreds of topics of interest in business, politics, government, education, crime, law, energy, health, family, science, race, rights, society, and culture.

***Literature Resource Center***—critical articles, literary analysis, and author biographies.

***Modern World History Online***—covers the people, places, and events in the broad expanse of history from the mid-15<sup>th</sup> century to the present.

***NoveList***—“your guide to reading”—fiction and nonfiction. Summaries, discussion guides, reviews, etc.

***Opposing Viewpoints in Context***—comprehensive coverage of today's social issues (including pro and con articles, reference articles, magazine and newspaper articles, statistics, and more).

***Professional Collection***—education topics—primarily for faculty.

***ProQuest Central K12***—millions of articles from more than 8,000 full-text scholarly journals, magazines, and newspapers.

***SIRS Issues Researcher***—focus on social, scientific, health, historic, economic, business, political, and global issues. The database also includes more than 3,000 maps (geographic and historical).

***Student Resources in Context***—comprehensive database that contains a collection of articles from reference works, newspaper and magazine articles, academic journal articles, and multimedia files.

***Teen Health and Wellness***—covers a wide variety of topics (body basics, diseases, drugs and alcohol, family life, friendships and dating, nutrition, fitness, grief and loss, etc.).
