Before I Die

Downham holds nothing back in her wrenching and exceptionally vibrant story about a sixteen-year-old girl with leukemia determined to do ten things before her imminent death (have sex, commit a crime, fall in love . . .). Although her rage feels palpable, she has decided to spend her remaining time living instead of dying.

1st book in the Hazelwood High series. The death of high school basketball star Rob Washington in an automobile accident affects the lives of his close friend Andy, who was driving the car, and many others in the school.

Just as Eden's relationships with her best friend and family are falling apart, she discovers a means of communicating with Will, whom she had a crush on until his death two weeks before their graduation. In Good Company offers a chance to communicate with Will or at least those parts of him that he had uploaded into a complex computer program. Eden becomes obsessed with talking by phone to the disembodied voice of the simulated Will, running the risk of losing contact with real life and with Oliver, who loves her.

Sorry for Your Loss

Pup Flanagan is the youngest of eight siblings. Almost three years after his brother Patrick died suddenly while at college, the Flanagans seem to have moved on—except for Pup and his brother Luke, a law student. Luke has developed a drinking problem, and Pup has failed at romance and is in danger of failing Studio Art. As a last-ditch effort to save his grade, he tries photography at his teacher's suggestion. With the help of a mentor, Albrihet, an advanced art student and Eritrean immigrant who is navigating problems within her own close-knit family, Pup finds a way to use his camera as a vehicle to express the impact of his loss.

Forman, Gayle

If I Stay (and sequel)

While in a coma following an automobile accident that killed her parents and younger brother, seventeen-year-old Mia, a gifted cellist, weighs whether to live with her grief or join her family in death.

Frank, E. R.

Wrecked

After a car accident seriously injures her best friend and kills her brother's girlfriend, sixteen-year-old Anna tries to cope with her guilt and grief while learning some truths about her family and herself.

Fuston, Margie

Vampires, Hearts, and Other Dead Things

As her father lies gravely ill with terminal pancreatic cancer, eighteen-year-old Victoria's last hope is to find a vampire in New Orleans, an impossible mission that rekindles a special friendship.

Garner, Paula

Phantom Limbs

Still reeling from the death of his little brother and the sudden departure of his first love Meg, Otis throws himself into swim training with Dara until Meg returns for the summer and Otis tries to rekindle their relationship.

Gilbert, Barbara **Stone Water**
Grant must decide whether or not to help his grandfather die.

Giles, Amy **That Night**
The year since a mass shooting shook their Queens neighborhood has played out differently for Jess and Lucas, both of whom were affected by that night in eerily similar and deeply personal ways.

Glasgow, Kathleen **How to Make Friends with the Dark**
Tiger, sixteen, has been pushing away from her overprotective mother--but when her mother dies suddenly, Tiger must learn to live when it feels like she is surrounded by darkness.

Green, John **Looking for Alaska**
Sixteen-year-old Miles' first year at Culver Creek Preparatory School in Alabama includes good friends and great pranks but is defined by the search for answers about life and death after a fatal car crash.

Griffin, Adele **Tighter**
Based on Henry James' The Turn of the Screw. When 17-year-old Jamie arrives on the idyllic New England island of Little Bly to work as a summer au pair, she is stunned to learn of the horror that precedes her. Seeking the truth surrounding a young couple's tragic deaths, Jamie discovers that she herself looks shockingly like the dead girl—and that she has a disturbing ability to sense the two ghosts. Jamie must navigate the increasingly blurred divide between the worlds of the living and the dead.

Grove, Vicki **Everything Breaks**
After his three best friends die in a car crash when he should have been driving, seventeen-year-old Tucker meets Charon, the Ferryman of Hades, and must decide whether to succumb to his grief or go on living.

Hand, Cynthia **The Last Time We Say Goodbye**
After her younger brother, Tyler, commits suicide, Lex struggles to work through her grief in the face of a family that has fallen apart, the sudden distance between her and her friends, and memories of Tyler that still feel all too real.

Hepler, Heather **We Were Beautiful**
Fifteen-year-old Mia's scarred face is a constant reminder of the car crash that killed her sister, but a summer at her grandmother's Manhattan apartment and new friends help her cope with her grief and find happiness again.

Jabaley, Jennifer **Lipstick Apology**
After her parents' sudden deaths, sixteen-year-old Emily leaves Pennsylvania for her aunt's New York City apartment, private school, and disconcerting new relationships, all the while puzzling over her mother's mysterious apology to her.

Johnson, Abigail **Even if I Fall**
Brooke Covington lost everything when her beloved older brother, Jason, confessed to the murder of his best friend, Calvin. When Brooke encounters Calvin's younger brother, Heath, on the side of the road and offers him a ride, everything changes. She needs someone to talk to ... and so does Heath. Soon they're meeting in secret and something tender begins to develop. But when a new secret comes out about the murder, Brooke has to choose whose pain she's willing to live with—her family's or Heath's—because she can't heal one without hurting the other.

Justesen, Kim Williams **The Deepest Blue**
When Mike's dad is killed in a car wreck, Mike wants to stay in his hometown and live with his dad's girlfriend, who has been like a mother to him for the last five years. But Mike's mother reappears in his life and demands that he return to her custody. After losing his dad, now he's supposed to move to the other side of the country to live with a mom who deserted him?

Kara, Jessica **Don't Ask If I'm Okay**
It's been a year since Gage survived a car accident that killed his best friend, Hunter. Without the person who always brought out the best in him, Gage doesn't know who he is. He likes working as a fry cook and loves his small-town friends and family, but they weren't in the wreck and he can't tell them how much he's still hurting. He just wants to forget all his pain and move on. When his stepdad shows him a dream job opening in one of his idol's restaurants, Gage knows this is his chance to convince everyone and himself that he's fine--but the more Gage tries to ignore his grief, the more volatile it becomes. When his temper finally turns on the people he loves, Gage must decide what real strength is--holding in his grief until it destroys him or asking for help and revealing his broken heart for all to see.

When David Ecchles walked into the band room at Carter High School last year and shot and killed his classmates and teacher, May McGintee was the only survivor. Now May's trying to keep it together as she starts a new year at a different school, but mostly she's itching to punch everyone she sees, especially anyone offering sympathy or attempts at comfort. Meanwhile, as the son of the lawyer who is defending David, Zach is also having a difficult return to school, with his friends mostly abandoning him. A chance meeting brings May and Zach together, and though she's initially furious to find out his connection to David's trial, she takes comfort in his undemanding friendship. It all goes bust, however, when May falls apart completely on the anniversary of the shooting, revealing a secret that Zach struggles to forgive.

Nat knows the truth behind Britt's "perfect" Instagram feed: Jules hated the pressure, the inauthenticity, the persona. There's so much more to Jules than Britt and her followers could ever know. As Nat connects with Jules's boyfriend, Carter, and their shared grief and guilt bonds them. Nat becomes determined to expose Britt—to place the blame--because if it was someone else's fault, maybe it wasn't hers.

Mather, Janice Lynn

Where Was Goodbye?

As she starts her senior year, six weeks after her brother Julian's suicide, Karmen struggles with strained family relationships, a distant best friend, and the search for understanding, but new friendships and a budding romance help her on her journey of healing and rediscovery.

Medema, Dante

Message Not Found

Mourning the death of her best friend Vanessa, seventeen-year-old Bailey creates a chat bot using their text messages and emails. Unsatisfied with the result, Bailey seeks out more data for the app and uncovers Vanessa's secrets which forces her to reconcile what she thought she knew about her friend with what Vanessa kept hidden.

Mitchard, Jacquelyn **All We Know of Heaven**

When Maureen and Bridget, two sixteen-year-old best friends who look like sisters, are in a terrible car accident and one of them dies, they are at first incorrectly identified at the hospital. As Maureen achieves a remarkable recovery, she must deal with the repercussions of the accident, the mix-up, and some choices she made while she was getting better.

Myers, Walter Dean **Shooter**

Written in the form of interviews, reports, and journal entries, the story of three troubled teenagers ends in a tragic school shooting.

Ness, Patrick **A Monster Calls**

Thirteen-year-old Conor awakens one night to find a monster outside his bedroom window—but not the one from the recurring nightmare that began when his mother became ill. This is an ancient, wild creature that wants him to face truth and loss.

Parsons, Mark H. **The 9:09 Project**

Seventeen-year-old Jamison finds hope after the loss of his mother and recognizes the role that family, friends, and even strangers can play in the healing process if you are open and willing to share your experience with others.

Pass, Nina de **The Year after You**

Cara has survived a car accident that killed her best friend, G. Battling grief, depression, and internal and external scars, Cara is sent to boarding school in Switzerland by her mother, who thinks all she needs is a clean slate. Cara journeys through the snowy Alps to Hope Hall with very little hope—but a unique trio, Ren, Hector, and Fred, have other things in mind. Not only do they want to befriend Cara, but they want to know all of her secrets. Cara shuts herself off, but the trio push back hard, and Cara reluctantly learns to open up to people who really care about her. She learns that with loyalty, love, and strong friendship, things get better, and she discovers the importance of forgiveness and acceptance.

Picoult, Jodi **The Pact**

The budding romance between two teenaged children of two families who have been lifelong friends and neighbors culminates tragically in an abortive suicide pact that leads to a gripping courtroom drama.

Reilly, K. J. **Four for the Road**

Asher Hunting wants revenge on the drunk driver who killed his mom and got off on a technicality. He ends up in a bereavement group where he makes some unexpected friends: Sloane, who lost her dad to cancer; Will, who lost his little brother to a different kind of cancer; and eighty-year-old Henry, who was married to his wife for fifty years until she decided to die on her own terms. Asher invites them on a road trip from New Jersey to Graceland-- not telling them he is going to steal his dad's car or the real reason that he wants to go to Tennessee. What begins as the road trip to revenge might just turn into a path towards forgiveness.

Reynolds, Jason **The Boy in the Black Suit**

Soon after his mother's death, Matt takes a job at a funeral home in his tough Brooklyn neighborhood. While attending and assisting with funerals, he begins to accept her death and his responsibilities as a man.

Reynolds, Jason **Long Way Down**

Driven by the secrets and vengeance that mark his street culture, 15-year-old Will contemplates over the course of 60 psychologically suspenseful seconds whether or not he is going to murder the person who killed his brother.

Reynolds, Justin A. **Early Departures**

What if you could bring your best friend back to life--but only for a short time? Jamal's best friend, Q, doesn't know that he died and that he's about to die again. He doesn't know that Jamal tried to save him. And that the reason they haven't been friends for two years is because Jamal blames Q for the accident that killed his parents. But what if Jamal could have a second chance? A new technology allows Q to be reanimated for a few weeks before he dies permanently. And Q's mom is not about to let anyone ruin this miracle by telling Q about his impending death. So how can Jamal fix everything if he can't tell Q the truth?

Reynolds, Justin A. **Opposite of Always**

When Jack and Kate meet at a party, Jack knows he's falling—hard. But then Kate dies. And their story should end there. Yet Kate's death sends Jack back to the beginning, the moment they first meet, and Kate's there again. Jack isn't sure if he's losing his mind. Still, if he has a chance to prevent Kate's death, he'll take it—even if that means believing in time travel. However, Jack will learn that his actions are not without consequences.

Richards, Alex **Accidental**

Johanna lost her mom in a car accident, and her father went AWOL when Johanna was just a baby. She is being raised by her grandparents who never talk about their daughter, her mother Mandy. When Robert Newsome, Johanna's father, comes back, he brings memories and pictures of Mandy. But a tragic car accident didn't kill Mandy-- it was Johanna who, at two years old,

accidentally shot her own mother with an unsecured gun. Now she's trying to sort through the return of her absentee father, her grandparents' lies, and her part in her mother's death. Can Johanna ever find a way to forgive herself?

Rosenblum, Cameron Kelly The Stepping Off Place

It's the summer before senior year. Reid is in the thick of Scofield High's in-crowd thanks to her best friend, Hattie, who has been her social oxygen since middle school. But summer is when Hattie goes to her family's Maine island home. Instead of sitting inside for eight weeks, waiting for her to return, Reid and their friend, Sam, enter into a pact to live it up, one party at a time. But days before Hattie is due home, Reid finds out the shocking news that Hattie has died by suicide. Driven by a desperate need to understand what went wrong, Reid searches for answers. In doing so, she uncovers painful secrets about the person she thought she knew better than herself. And the truth will force Reid to reexamine everything.

Rufener, Brenda Since We Last Spoke

Estranged after a fatal car accident involving their older siblings leads to a restraining order between their bitter families, Aggi and Max reunite at a lakehouse party and reflect on how they had just fallen in love before they were separated.

Sabatini, Kim Touching the Surface

In the afterlife for the fourth time, seventeen-year-old Elliot knows she has one last chance. Before she can begin her fourth life, though, she must delve into her past, earn the forgiveness of her best friend, reconnect with her soul mate, and set things right for the future.

Sebold, Alice The Lovely Bones

Looking down from heaven, fourteen-year-old Susie Salmon recounts her rape and murder and watches her family as they cope with their grief and "the lovely bones" growing around her absence.

Sheinmel, Alyssa The Castle School (for Troubled Girls)

Paralyzed by grief, Moira feels punished when her parents send her to a therapeutic boarding school in Maine where she meets eleven other troubled girls and gradually begins to understand her parents' true intentions behind sending her there.

Sorosiak, Carlie Wild Blue Wonder

Following a tragic boating accident during the summer before her senior year of high school, Quinn goes through life in a daze of grief until the new boy in town, Alexander, helps her begin to understand the truth about love and loss.

Stevens, Courtney C. The Lies about Truth

A teen struggles to overcome both the physical and emotional scars that resulted from an accident that killed her best friend.

Sweeney, Kate Catch the Light

After the death of her father, Marigold ("Mary") leaves California behind to live with her aunt in rural New York. There she feels caught between her old life and new one when she forms a special connection with a fellow photographer. When things fall apart, Mary will have to come to terms with the way the loss of her dad has changed who she is.

Valentine, Jenny Me, the Missing, and the Dead

When a series of chance events leaves him in possession of an urn with ashes, sixteen-year-old Londoner, Lucas Swain, becomes convinced that its occupant, Violet Park, is communicating with him, initiating a voyage of self-discovery that forces him to finally confront the events surrounding his father's sudden disappearance.

Vincent, Rachel No One Is Alone

When Michaela's mom dies and she has to move in with her dad, she discovers that he's been married with kids all this time and that she's the product of an affair.

Walton, K. M. Ultimatum

When their mother dies, two very different brothers become even more distant—but when their father's alcoholism sends him into liver failure, the two boys must come face-to-face with their demons—and each other—if they are going to survive an uncertain future.

Zarr, Sara How to Save a Life

Told from their own viewpoints, seventeen-year-old Jill, in grief over the loss of her father, and Mandy, nearly nineteen, are thrown together when Jill's mother agrees to adopt Mandy's unborn child—but nothing turns out as they had anticipated.

Zentner, Jeff Goodbye Days

It was just a text: Carver wanted to know when his three best friends were going to pick him up—but those three best friends got into a car accident and never made it to him. Carver can't stop blaming himself and his text for their deaths, and things get worse after a judge is also interested in pointing the finger at him

Zorn, Claire

Protected

Nearly a year after her popular older sister's accidental death, Hannah meets Anne, a guidance counselor, and Josh, a potential new friend, who offer her the chance to move forward.

The Book Thief

Trying to make sense of the horrors of World War II, Death relates the story of Liesel--a young German girl whose book-stealing and story-telling talents help sustain her family and the Jewish man they are hiding, as well as their neighbors.
