Aveyard, Victoria ***The Red Queen*** (1st in series)
When her latent supernatural powers manifest in front of a noble court, Mare, a thief in a world divided between commoners and superhumans, is forced to assume the role of lost princess before risking everything to help a growing rebellion.

Bodeen, S. A. ***The Compound*** (and sequel)
After his parents, two sisters, and he have spent six years in a vast underground compound built by his wealthy father to protect them from a nuclear holocaust, Eli discovers that his father has perpetrated a monstrous hoax on all of them.

Bracken, Alexandra ***Darkest Minds*** (1st in series)
Sixteen-year-old Ruby breaks out of a government-run "rehabilitation camp" for teens who acquired dangerous powers after surviving a virus that wiped out most American children.

Cass, Kiera ***The Selection*** (1st in series)
Sixteen-year-old America Singer is living in the caste-divided nation of Illea, which formed after the war that destroyed the United States. America is chosen to compete in the Selection--a contest to see which girl can win the heart of Illea's prince--but all she really wants is a chance for a future with her secret love, Aspen, who is a caste below her.

Charbonneau, Julie ***The Testing*** (1st in series)
Cia Vale is one of four teens chosen to represent her small colony at the annual Testing, an intensive mental and physical examination aimed at identifying the best and brightest who will go on to the University and help rebuild their shattered world. As the Testing pushes its candidates to the breaking point, Cia is forced to fight for survival.

Clare, Cassandra ***Clockwork Angel*** (1st in series)
When 16-year-old orphan Tessa Fell's brother vanishes, her search for him leads her into Victorian-era London's

supernatural underworld. When she discovers that she herself is a Downworlder, she must learn to trust the demon-killing Shadowhunters if she ever wants to learn to control her powers and find her brother.

Condie, Ally ***Matched*** (1st in series)
Cassie has always followed the autocratic Society without question. When Xander's face is displayed on the screen at the Matching ceremony, she knows that they are the perfect mates. However, Ky Markham's face also flashed on the screen. Although the Society claims it was a glitch, Cassidy cannot stop thinking about Ky.

Dashner, James ***Maze Runner*** (1st in series)
Sixteen-year-old Thomas wakes up with no memory in the middle of a maze and realizes he must work with the community in which he finds himself if he is to escape.

Derting, Kimberly ***The Pledge*** (1st in series)
In a dystopian kingdom where the classes are separated by the languages they speak, Charlaina "Charlie" Hart has a secret gift that is revealed when she meets a mysterious young man named Max.

DeStefano, Lauren ***Wither*** (1st in series)
After modern science turns every human into a genetic time bomb with men dying at age 25 and women dying at age 20, girls are kidnapped and married off in order to repopulate the world.

Dunn, Pintip ***Forget Tomorrow*** (and sequel)
After being imprisoned for a crime she has yet to commit, Callie, with the help of her childhood crush Logan, escapes in hopes of running from the government and her future.

Fisher, Catherine ***Incarceron*** (1st in series)
To free herself from an upcoming arranged marriage, Claudia, the daughter of the Warden of Incarceron, a

futuristic prison with a mind of its own, decides to help a young prisoner escape.

Grant, Michael ***Gone*** (1st in series)
In a small town in California, everyone over the age of 14 disappears, setting up a battle between the remaining town residents and students from a local private school, as well as those who have "The Power" and are able to perform supernatural feats and those who do not.

Hautman, Pete ***Rash***
In a future society that has decided it would "rather be safe than free," 16-year-old Bo's anger control problems land him in a tundra jail where he survives with the help of his running skills and an artificial intelligence program named Bork.

Higson, Charlie ***The Enemy*** (1st in series)
After a disease turns everyone over 16 into brainless, decomposing, flesh-eating creatures, a group of teenagers leave their shelter and set out on a journey across London to the safe haven of Buckingham Palace.

Hirsch, Jeff ***The Eleventh Plague***
Twenty years after the start of the war that caused the Collapse, 15-year-old Stephen, his father, and his grandfather travel post-Collapse America scavenging. When his grandfather dies and his father decides to risk everything to save the lives of two strangers, Stephen's life is turned upside down.

Ishiguro, Kazuo ***Never Let Me Go***
A reunion with two childhood friends--Ruth and Tommy--draws Kath and her companions on a nostalgic odyssey into the supposedly idyllic years of their lives at Hailsham, an isolated private school in the serene English countryside, and a dramatic confrontation with the truth about their childhoods and about their lives in the present.

Lu, Marie ***Legend*** (1st in series)

In a dark future where North America has split into two warring nations, fifteen-year-olds Day, a famous criminal, and June, the brilliant soldier hired to capture him, discover that they have a common enemy.

Malley, Gemma ***The Declaration*** (1st in series)

In 2140 England, where drugs enable people to live forever and children are illegal, Anna, an obedient “Surplus” training to become a house servant, discovers that her birth parents are trying to find her.

Mariz, Rae ***The Unidentified***

In a futuristic alternative school set in a shopping mall where video-game-playing students are observed and used by corporate sponsors for market research, Katey Dade struggles to figure out where she fits in and whether she even wants to.

Mullin, Mike ***Ashfall*** (1st in series)

After the eruption of the Yellowstone supervolcano destroys his city and its surroundings, Alex must journey from Cedar Falls, Iowa, to Illinois to find his parents and sister, trying to survive in a transformed landscape and a new society in which all the old rules of living have vanished.

Ness, Patrick ***The Knife of Never Letting Go*** (1st in series)

Pursued by power-hungry Prentiss and mad minister Aaron, young Todd and Viola set out across New World searching for answers about his colony’s true past and seeking a way to warn the ship bringing hopeful settlers from Old World.

O’Brien, Caragh ***Birthmarked*** (1st in series)

In a future world baked dry by the sun and divided into those who live inside the wall and those who live outside it, 16-year-old Gaia Stone is forced into a difficult choice when her parents are arrested and taken into the city.

Oliver, Lauren ***Delirium*** (1st in series)

Lena looks forward to receiving the government-mandated cure that prevents the delirium of love and leads to a safe, predictable, and happy life—until she falls in love 95 days before her 18th birthday and her treatment.

Pearson, Mary ***Adoration of Jenna Fox*** (1st in series)

In the not-too-distant future, when biotechnological advances have made synthetic bodies and brains possible

but illegal, a 17-year-old girl, recovering from a serious accident and suffering from memory lapses, learns a startling secret about her existence.

Pfeffer, Susan ***Life As We Knew It*** (1st in series)

Through journal entries, Miranda describes her family’s struggle to survive after a meteor hits the moon, causing worldwide tsunamis, earthquakes, and volcanic eruptions.

Price, Lissa ***Starters*** (and sequel)

To support herself and her younger brother in a future Beverly Hills, sixteen-year-old Callie hires her body out to seniors who want to experience being young again, and she lives a fairy-tale life until she learns that her body will commit murder, unless her mind can stop it.

Reeve, Philip ***Mortal Engines*** (1st in series)

In the distant future, when cities move about and consume smaller towns, a 15-year-old apprentice is pushed out of London by the man he most admires and must seek answers in the perilous Out-Country.

Rossi, Veronica ***Under the Never Sky*** (1st in series)

Aria and Perry, two teens from radically different societies—one highly advanced, the other primitive—hate being dependent on one another—until they fall in love.

Roth, Veronica ***Divergent*** (1st in series)

In a future Chicago, 16-year-old Beatrice Prior must choose among the five predetermined factions to define her identity for the rest of her life, a decision made more difficult when she discovers that she is an anomaly who does not fit into any one group and that the society she lives in is not perfect after all.

Shusterman, Neal ***Unwind*** (1st in series)

In a future world where those between the ages of 13 and 18 can have their lives “unwound” and their body parts harvested for use by others, three teens go to extreme lengths to uphold their beliefs—and, perhaps, save their own lives.

Simmons, Kristen ***Article 5*** (1st in series)

Seventeen-year-old Ember Miller has perfected the art of keeping a low profile in a future society in which Moral Statutes have replaced the Bill of Rights and offenses carry stiff penalties, but when Chase, the only boy she has ever

loved, arrests her rebellious mother, Ember must take action.

Smith, Alexander ***Lockdown*** (1st in series)

When 14-year-old Alex is framed for murder, he becomes an inmate in the Furnace Penitentiary, where brutal inmates and sadistic guards reign, boys who disappear in the middle of the night sometimes return weirdly altered, and escape just might be possible.

Snyder, Maria V. ***Inside Out*** (and sequel)

Trella, a scrub whose life consists of cleaning for the socially superior Uppers, finds her peaceful life disturbed when she encounters a prophet who promises a better life for her people and ends up in the middle of a rebellion.

Wells, Robison ***Variant*** (and sequel)

After years in foster homes, 17-year-old Benson Fisher applies to New Mexico’s Maxfield Academy in hopes of securing a brighter future, but instead he finds that the school is a prison and no one is what he or she seems.

Westerfeld, Scott ***Uglies*** (1st in series)

Fifteen-year-old Tally’s eerily harmonious society gives extreme makeovers to teens on their sixteenth birthdays, supposedly conferring equivalent evolutionary advantages to all. When a top-secret agency threatens to leave Tally ugly forever unless she spies on runaway teens, she agrees to infiltrate the Smoke, a shadowy colony of refugees from the “tyranny of physical perfection.”

White, Andrea ***No Child’s Game***

In a future where the government plies the public with nonstop reality television to provide distraction from the rampant poverty, and higher education is won or lost on a dice toss, Historical Survivor is the most popular program on the tube. Teens Andrew, Polly, Robert, Billy, and Grace have been chosen to reenact Robert F. Scott’s expedition to the South Pole in Antarctic Historical Survivor.

Zevin, Gabrielle ***All These Things I’ve Done*** (1st in series)

In a dystopian future where chocolate and caffeine are contraband, teenage cellphone use is illegal, and water and paper are carefully rationed, 16-year-old Anya Balanchine finds herself thrust unwillingly into the spotlight as heir apparent to an important New York City crime family.
