Adrian, Susan Tunnel Vision

When Jake Lukin reveals his psychic ability, he is forced to become a government asset in order to keep his mother and sister safe, but Rachel, the girl he likes, tries to help him live his own life instead of tunneling through others.

Alender, Katie Bad Girls Don't Die (and sequels)

When fifteen-year-old Lexi's younger sister Kasey begins behaving strangely and their old Victorian house seems to take on a life of its own, Lexi investigates and discovers some frightening facts about previous occupants of the house that lead her to believe that many lives are in danger.

Alender, Katie The Dead Girls of Hysteria Hall

Murdered by a spirit in her house, which was previously an insane asylum, sixteen-year-old Cordelia wanders the house, meeting other trapped ghosts and learning the house's dark secrets, searching for a way to save her family—and perhaps herself.

Alender, Katie Famous Last Words

Willa has just moved to California with her mother and film director stepfather and will be attending a private school--but her real problem is that she keeps seeing things that are not really there, like a dead body in the swimming pool, and her visions may be connected to a serial killer that is stalking young girls in Hollywood.

Barzak, Christopher The Gone Away Place

After tornadoes demolish Newfoundland, Ohio, Ellie, seventeen, is haunted by ghosts of the dead, as well as survivors struggling to cope, but a chance encounter shows her how to free the lingering spirits.

Bedford, Martyn Flip

A teenager wakes up inside another boy's body and faces a life-or-death quest to return to his true self or be trapped forever in the wrong existence.

Bell, Crystal J. The Lamplighter

After the death of her father, Temperance assumes the lamplighter position in her coastal whaling village and drives away the unnatural fog that descends each night, but when two girls go missing and authorities doubt her abilities, Temperance uncovers dark truths and faces a choice between silence and risking her own and her sister's fate among the vanished.

Bick, Ilsa J. Draw the Dark

Seventeen-year-old Christian is a painter who is developing some disturbing talents. He can paint others' thoughts and memories, perhaps even influencing their actions. He is also having some vivid dreams in which he inhabits the body of a child in the 1940s, watching as a town business leader uses German POWs as laborers. Christian awakes from one of these fugues to find himself blamed for painting swastikas on a barn, a terrible event that results in two fortuitous meetings: a dying old man in a nursing home with a connection to Christian's dreams and a friendly psychiatrist who becomes his chief confidant.

Black, Holly The Coldest Girl in Coldtown

When seventeen-year-old Tana wakes up following a party in the aftermath of a violent vampire attack, she travels to Coldtown, a quarantined Massachusetts city full of vampires, with her ex-boyfriend and a mysterious vampire boy in tow.

Black, Teri Bailey Girl at the Grave

As a child, Valentine saw her mother murder the wealthiest man in their Connecticut town and then hang at the gallow for it. Neglected by her father, she's learned to fend for herself, living in a crumbling estate that feels haunted by the past. Now a top student at Drake Academy, she's determined to prove herself and overcome her mother's crime. But like all small towns, Feavers Crossing has a stiflingly long memory. When a new string of murders occurs, all signs point to the daughter of a killer as the most likely suspect. Outcast and isolated, Valentine finds an unlikely ally in Rowan Blackshaw, the son of the man her mother murdered all those years ago. Vowing to finally clear her family name, Valentine hunts for the real killer. Her search leads her to dangerously powerful families, the graveyard nestled behind her home, and even her own psyche where must finally face the dark secrets hidden there.

Bobulski, Chelsea Remember Me

Nell Martin is moving again, this time to the Winslow Grand Hotel, built in 1878. As Nell is settling in, strange things begin to happen. Doors lock of their own accord, writing appears on bathroom walls-- and most horrifying of all-- visions of a dead boy permeate her waking life. Thinking it was her mind playing tricks on her, she soon finds the past and the present colliding as she learns horrific details of a murder that happened at the hotel in 1907 involving a girl named Lea.

Bovalino, Tori The Devil Makes Three

When Tess and Eliot stumble upon an ancient book hidden in a secret tunnel beneath the school library, they accidentally release a devil from his book-bound prison, and he'll stop at nothing to stay free. He'll manipulate all the ink in the library books to do his bidding, he'll murder in the stacks, and he'll bleed into every inch of Tess's life until his freedom is permanent. Forced to work together, Tess and Eliot have to find a way to re-trap the devil before he kills everyone they know and love, including, increasingly, each other.

Brant, Wendy Zenn Diagram

Math nerd Eva Walker finds her ability to read other people's emotions by touching them or an item they own to be helpful when she is tutoring, until she meets Zenn, a boy with a troubling past who she cannot seem to read.

Bray, Libba The Diviners (and sequels)

Seventeen-year-old Evie O'Neill is thrilled when she is exiled from small-town Ohio to New York City in 1926, even when a rash of occult-based murders thrusts Evie and her uncle, curator of The Museum of American Folklore, Superstition, and the Occult, into the thick of the investigation.

Capin, Hannah I Am Margaret Moore

A year ago at the elite Marshall Summer Naval School, Margaret Moore presumably drowned herself from heartbreak. This summer the remaining girls from Deck Five will ensure that the truth is heard.

Clare, Cassandra Chain of Gold

*I*st book in The Last Hours series. Cordelia Carstairs, a Shadowhunter trained to battle demons, travels with her brother to London where they reconnect with childhood friends but soon must face devastating demon attacks in the quarantined city.

Clare, Cassandra City of Bones (and sequels)

Ist book in Mortal Instruments series. Suddenly able to see demons and the Darkhunters who are dedicated to returning them to their own dimension, fifteen-year-old Clary Fray is drawn into this bizzare world when her mother disappears and Clary herself is almost killed by a monster.

Clare, Cassandra Clockwork Angel (and sequels)

1st book in Infernal Devices series. When sixteen-year-old orphan Tessa Fell's older brother suddenly vanishes, her search for him leads her into Victorian-era London's dangerous supernatural underworld. When she discovers that she herself is a Downworlder, she must learn to trust the demon-killing Shadowhunters if she ever wants to learn to control her powers and find her brother.

Clare, Cassandra Lady Midnight (and sequels)

 l^{st} book in Dark Artifices series. Shadowhunter Emma Carstairs and her parabatai Julian Blackthorn race to stop a demonic plot that threatens Los Angeles

Clement-Moore, Rosemary Texas Gothic

Seventeen-year-old Amy Goodnight has long been the one who makes her family of witches seem somewhat normal to others, but while spending a summer with her sister caring for their aunt's farm, Amy becomes the center of weirdness when she becomes tied to a powerful ghost.

de Becerra, Katya Oasis

Alif had exciting summer plans—working on her father's archaeological dig site in the desert with four close friends...and a very cute research assistant. Then the sandstorm hit. With their camp wiped away, Alif and the others find themselves lost on the sands, seemingly doomed...until they find the oasis. It has everything they need: food, water, and shade--and mysterious ruins that hide a deadly secret. As reality begins to shift around them, they question what's real and what's a mirage. The answers turn Alif and her friends against each other, and they begin to wonder if they've truly been saved. And while it was easy to walk into the oasis, it may be impossible to leave...

Delsol, Wendy Stork (and sequels)

After her parents' divorce, Katla and her mother move from Los Angeles to Norse Falls, Minnesota, where Kat immediately alienates two boys at her high school and, improbably, discovers a kinship with a mysterious group of elderly women--the Icelandic Stork Society--who "deliver souls." A modern-day retelling of Hans Christian Andersen's "Snow Queen."

Doherty, Berlie The Company of Ghosts

Ellie is excited to be going with Morag's family to their beautiful island, but when she finds herself abandoned there, things begin to change. Footsteps, shadows, strange lights, a haunting song—more and more she becomes aware that she is not really on her own.

Ellis, Kat Burden Falls

When someone close to Ava Thorn is brutally murdered and Ava becomes the primary suspect, she starts to wonder if ghostly legends surrounding her town might be more fact than fiction.

Fraisat, Ann A Place for Vanishing

Looking for a fresh start, sixteen-year-old Libby and her family return to her mother's childhood home only to discover that the house's strange beauty may disguise a sinister past.

French, Gillian The Door to January

Natalie has been having nightmares since she moved away from Bernier, Maine. She returns to town to confront the boy she's trying not to trust and the door in her dreams that leads to a murky past that seems to be someone else's world.

Fuston, Margie Vampires, Hearts, and Other Dead Things

As her father lies gravely ill with terminal pancreatic cancer, eighteen-year-old Victoria's last hope is to find a vampire in New Orleans, an impossible mission that rekindles a special friendship.

Garcia, Kami Beautiful Creatures (and sequels)

In a small South Carolina town, where it seems little has changed since the Civil War, sixteen-year-old Ethan is powerfully drawn to Lena, a new classmate with whom he shares a psychic connection and whose family hides a dark secret that may be revealed on her sixteenth birthday.

Glaze, Amanda The Second Death of Edie and Violet Bond

Seventeen-year-old twins--and powerful mediums--Edie and Violet Bond are part of a Spiritualist show, a tight-knit group of young women who express unladylike talents and opinions under the guise of communing with spirits. When the dark spirit responsible for their mother's death crosses into the land of the living, the twins race against time to uncover a killer who will stop at nothing to cheat death.

Hand, Cynthia My Plain Jane

Mysteries abound on the moors—and not all of them are of this world. When Charlotte Brontë's best friend, Jane Eyre, is offered a job with the Society for the Relocation of Wayward Spirits, Charlotte is dismayed that Jane takes a position as a governess at Thornfield Hall instead—so Charlotte decides that she's the right person for the job, even if she can't see ghosts like Jane can. Nevertheless, she persists, joining her brother and his mentor, Alexander Blackwood, in serving the Society by trying to recruit Jane. Jane, however, has fallen in love with her employer, Mr. Rochester, and has no interest in leaving. A domino line of events follows the two friends as they find love, work, ghosts, and strengths they never suspected.

Hand, Cynthia Unearthly (and sequels)

Sixteen-year-old Clara Gardner's purpose as an angel-blood begins to manifest itself, forcing her family to pull up stakes and move to Jackson, Wyoming, where she learns that danger and heartbreak come with her powers.

Harvey, Alyxandra Haunting Violet

Violet Willoughby doesn't believe in ghosts. But they believe in her. After spending years participating in her mother's elaborate ruse as a fraudulent medium, Violet is about as skeptical as they come in all matters supernatural. Now that she is being visited by a very persistent ghost, one who suffered a violent death, Violet can no longer ignore her unique ability. She must figure out what this ghost is trying to communicate and figure it out quickly because the killer is still on the loose. Afraid of ruining her chance to escape her mother's scheming through an advantageous marriage, Violet must keep her ability secret. The only person who can help her is Colin, a friend she's known since childhood and whom she has grown to love. He understands the true Violet, but helping her on this path means they might never be together. Can Violet find a way to help this ghost without ruining her own chance at a future free of lies?

Hawkins, Rachel Hex Hall (and sequels)

After a prom-night spell goes badly wrong, witch Sophie Mercer is exiled to an isolated reform school for wayward Prodigium, supernaturally gifted teenagers, where she learns that an unknown predator has been attacking students.

Henry, April The Lonely Dead

Adele has the ability to see and talk to the dead but has spent years denying her gift. When she encounters her ex-best-friend Tori in a shallow grave in the woods, her gift turns into a curse. Without an alibi, Adele becomes the prime suspect in Tori's murder and must work with Tori's ghost to find the real killer. But what if the killer finds Adele first?

Hill, Janet Lucy Crisp and the Vanishing House

After moving to a seemingly quaint and quiet new town, Lucy faces a new reality in which fairies exist, weather can be bottled, and witches hold grudges.

Hocking, Amanda

Switched (and sequels)

Ist book in Trylle series. When Wendy Everly was six years old, her mother was convinced she was a monster and tried to kill her. Eleven years later Wendy learns that her mother was right and that she is actually a changeling troll who, at the age of seventeen, must be returned to her rightful home

Hodkin, Michelle The Unbecoming of Mara Dyer (and sequels)

Seventeen-year-old Mara cannot remember the accident that took the lives of three of her friends, but, after moving from Rhode Island to Florida, finding love with Noah, and more deaths, she realizes that uncovering something buried in her memory might save her family and her future.

Holder, Nancy Crusade

An international team of six teenaged vampire hunters, trained in Salamanca, Spain, goes to New Orleans seeking to rescue team-memberJenn's younger sister as the vampires escalate their efforts to take over the Earth.

Hunt, Leo 13 Days of Midnight

When his estranged father dies, sixteen-year-old Luke inherits eight spirits who want revenge for their enslavement. With Halloween fast approaching, he has only thirteen days to give them their eternal rest or he may join their ghostly ranks.

Hunter, C. C. This Heart of Mine

Seventeen-year-old Leah MacKenzie is heartless. An artificial heart in a backpack is keeping her alive. However, this route only offers her a few years. With her rare blood type, a transplant isn't likely. Living like you are dying isn't all it's cracked up to be. But when a heart becomes available, she's given a second chance at life—except Leah discovers who the donor was — a boy from her school — and they're saying he killed himself. Plagued with dreams since the transplant, she realizes she may hold the clues to what really happened.

Jackson, Corrine Touched (and sequels)

1st book in Sense Thieves series. Possessing powers that enable her to heal others while taking their injuries into herself, Remy O'Malley is sent to live with her estranged father and pursues a forbidden relationship with Asher Blackwell, who sacrificed his senses to become immortal.

Johnson, Maureen The Name of the Star (and sequels)

*I*st book in Shades of London series. Rory, of Boueuxlieu, Louisiana, is spending a year at a London boarding school when she witnesses a murder by a Jack the Ripper copycat and becomes involved with the very unusual investigation.

King, Stephen Bag of Bones

Plagued by vivid nightmares of the summer house he had shared with his late wife, grieving widower Mike Noonan returns to his former Maine getaway only to find a town in the grip of a ruthless millionaire and tormented by a series of ghostly visitations.

King, Stephen The Dead Zone

After four and a half years in a coma, Johnny Smith awakens with knowledge of the death zone and an ability to see the future, a horrible power that he does not want and cannot escape.

King, Stephen The Green Mile

The story of a convicted killer on death row and one of the prison guards assigned there.

King, Stephen The Gunslinger (and sequels)

1st book in Dark Tower series. Roland, the world's last gunslinger, tracks an enigmatic Man in Black toward a forbidding dark tower, fighting forces both mortal and other-worldly on his quest.

King, Stephen Insomnia

Ralph Roberts, a widower suffering from insomnia, begins to experience strange visual phenomena and is unable to believe that they are merely hallucinations.

Koontz, Dean From the Corner of His Eye

Bartholomew Lampion, born under miraculous yet tragic circumstances, has the most unusual and mesmerizing eyes ever seen. As he grows, he begins to exhibit abilities that defy physics. Angel, born in another city at the same time as Bartholomew, is also a miracle child; as she grows, she demonstrates the ability to see the world as it really exists. At the time of their births, ruthless and cunning Junior dreams that someone named Bartholomew will lead to his downfall. These three lives intertwine as this saga barrels along toward their inevitable confrontation

Koontz, Dean Odd Thomas (and sequels)

His name really is Odd, but many would call anyone odd who sees ghosts and harbingers of mayhem called borachs and who homes in on mass murderers by means of PMS--that's psychic magnetism syndrome, according to his girlfriend, Stormy. Few others, however, know of his capabilities, which suits the 20-year-old short-order cook just fine. He would be better off without his gift because, as he says, when he sees dead people, he does something about it.

Koontz, Dean Watchers

Two creatures, the end result of experiments in genetic engineering and enhanced intelligence, escape from a government laboratory and bring either doom or a touching new kind of love to those they encounter.

Kostova, Elizabeth The Historian

Discovering a medieval book and a cache of letters, a motherless American girl becomes the latest in a series of historians, including her late father, who investigate the possible surviving legacy of Vlad the Impaler.

LaCour, Nina Watch Over Me

Mila is used to being alone. Maybe that's why she said yes. Yes to a second chance in this remote place, among the flowers and the fog and the crash of waves far below. But she hadn't known about the ghosts. Newly graduated from high school, Mila has aged out of the foster care system. When she's offered a teaching job and a place to live on and isolated part of Northern California coast, she immediately accepts. Maybe she will finally find a new home--a real home. The farm is a refuge, but it's also haunted by the past. And Mila's own memories are starting to rise to the surface.

Landers, Melissa Make Me a Liar

It's an open secret at Harvey Davis High School that Tia Dante can solve all your problems (for a fee, of course). As one of the few blessed with the genetic gift of transferable consciousness, she can slip inside your mind and do your dirty work--humiliate your cheating boyfriend, bring a bully to his knees, tell your boss where to stick it--and then return your body with no one the wiser. Everything is going smoothly during a routine job, until Tia catches a breaking news broadcast: live video coverage of her (body) murdering the town prosecutor in cold blood.

Lange, Erin Jade Mere Mortals

Two teenage vampires are turned mortal and must face the greatest nightmare of all--high school.

Laurie, Victoria Forever, Again

Sixteen-year-old Lily Bennett becomes wrapped up in a murder mystery that she learns might be linked to her past . . . and her future.

Laurie, Victoria When

Sixteen-year-old Maddie Flynn cannot help but see the death date of everyone she meets or sees in a photograph or online, and her alcoholic mother exploits this by having her do readings for money—but when Maddie predicts the death of a young boy, she becomes the center of an FBI investigation.

Leighton, Lisa Now You See Her

After a bizarre accident, Amelia wakes up in the body of her social media darling rival, Sophie, and she is forced to figure out what happened and how it ties to her mother's mysterious past before she can switch back.

Leno, Katrina Horrid

Following her father's death, Jane North-Robinson and her mom move from California to the dreary, dilapidated North Manor in Maine where her mother grew up. As autumn arrives, Jane finds solace in old books and memories of her dad. She makes new friends but struggles to tamp down her anger when facing bullying. Then Jane discovers that the "storage room" her mom has kept locked isn't for storage at all: it's a little girl's bedroom, left untouched for years and not quite as empty of inhabitant as it appears.

Lund, Natalie The Wolves Are Watching

The night little Madison disappears from her crib, Luce sees a pair of eyes-two points of gold deep in the forest behind her house-and feels certain they belong to a wolf. Her town, Picnic, Illinois, is the kind of place where everyone knows one another and no one locks their doors. It's not the kind of place where a toddler goes missing without a trace, where wolves lurk in the shadows. In town, people are quick to blame Madison's mom. But when Luce's English teacher shares an original script about the disappearance of another little girl in Picnic back in 1870, Luce begins to notice similarities that she can't ignore.

When Rose Colter hears a voicemail from her own phone playing on her car radio, she follows the broadcast to the small town of Lotus Valley, where she discovers that the residents of the town believes she's the prophesied bringer of a catastrophic flood.

Marsh, Sarah Glenn The Girls Are Never Gone

Seventeen-year-old Dare plans to spend her summer debunking a haunting at an historic estate with a dark past, but she finds herself in a life-or-death struggle against a malignant ghost.

Marshall, Kate Alice The Narrow

Everyone has heard the story of the Narrow. The river that runs behind the Atwood School is only a few feet across and seemingly placid, but beneath the surface, the waters are deep and vicious. It's said that no one who has fallen in has ever survived. Eden White knows that isn't true. Six years ago, she saw Delphine Fournier fall into the Narrow--and live. Delphine now lives in careful isolation, sealed off from the world. Even a single drop of unpurified water could be deadly to her, and no one but Eden has any idea why. Eden has never told anyone what she saw or spoken to Delphine since, but now, unable to cover her tuition, she has to make a deal: her expenses will be paid in return for serving as a live-in companion to Delphine. Suddenly Eden is waking up to wet footprints tracking to the end of her bed, the sound of rain on the windows when the skies are clear, and a ghostly silhouette in her doorway. Something is haunting Delphine--and now it's coming for Eden, too.

Mather, Adriana How to Hang a Witch (and sequel)

Follows fifteen-year-old Samantha Mather who has moved to Salem with her stepmother 300 years after her family hanged witches there to find she is ostracized by the witch descendants at school as she unravels the lost secrets of the hangings and her family. The author is a descendant of Cotton Mather, one of the men responsible for the Salem witch trials.

McCauley, Kyrie We Can Be Heroes

After a girl is killed by her ex-boyfriend in a school shooting, her two best friends attempt to memorialize her in a town economically dependent on the shooter's family

Meyer, Stephenie Twilight (and sequels)

When seventeen-year-old Bella leaves Phoenix to live with her father in Forks, Washington, she meets an exquisitely handsome boy at school for whom she feels an overwhelming attraction and whom she comes to realize is not wholly human.

Miller, Kirsten Don't Tell a Soul

People say the house is cursed. It preys on the weakest, and young women are its favorite victims. All Bram wanted was to disappear from her old life and the scandal that continues to haunt her. She ends up in Louth, a tiny town on the Hudson River where her uncle, James, has been renovating an old mansion. The old manor is creepy-- and the people of Louth don't want outsiders in their town. They tell legends about the Dead Girls—girls whose lives were cut short in the very house Bram now calls home.

Morgan, Kass The Ravens (and sequel)

Kappa Rho Nu may seem like your average sorority. They're the most powerful girls on Westerly College's Savannah, Georgia, campus. But the sisters of Kappa Rho Nu share a secret: they're a coven of witches. Scarlett Winters, daughter of a legacy Raven, is determined to live up to her mother's impossible expectations of becoming Kappa Rho Nu's next president. Vivi Deveraux vows to do whatever it takes to be part of the magical sisterhood. But someone has discovered the Ravens' secret-- and will do anything to see these witches burn.

Morris, Paula Dark Souls

Sixteen-year-old Miranda Tennant arrives in York, England, with her parents and brother, trying to recover from the terrible accident that killed her best friend. While in the haunted city, she falls in love for the first time as two boys, one also suffering from a great loss and the other a ghost, fight for her attention.

Moulton, Courtney Wardens of Eternity

In the days leading up to World War II, orphaned immigrant Ziva must rely on her survival instinct and her magical abilities to outmaneuver ancient Egyptian gods and resurrect a revered queen to stop Nazis intent on global destruction.

Neiheiser, Tyffany D. Not Dead Enough

Charlotte survived the car crash that killed her boyfriend Jerry, but that night, everything changed. Charlotte wants desperately to get back to "normal," --whatever that means now-- and start reconnecting with friends she hasn't spoken to in months. And she's trying to work through her PTSD with the help of her therapist, only she can't tell the truth about Jerry or what really happened the night he died. Just when Charlotte thinks she might be moving on, someone starts sending her threatening messages claiming to be Jerry, saying things only he would know. But it can't really be Jerry because there's no such thing as ghosts. The cold spots in her room must be a draft and the noises she hears must be the house creaking. There has to be a logical explanation for all of it. Because if ghosts are real, then Jerry came back for her--just like he always said he would.

O'Donoghue, Caroline All Our Hidden Gifts (and sequel)

Maeve Chambers doesn't have much going for her. Not only does she feel like the sole idiot in a family of geniuses, she managed to drive away her best friend Lily a year ago. When she finds a pack of dusty old tarot cards at school and begins to give scarily accurate readings to the girls in her class, however, she realizes she's found her gift at last. Things are looking up - until she discovers a strange card in the deck that definitely shouldn't be there. And two days after she convinces her ex-best friend to have a reading, Lily disappears. Can Maeve, her new friend Fiona, and Lily's brother Roe find her? And will Maeve's new gift be enough to bring Lily back before she's gone for good?

Parker, Amy Christine Flight 171

Devon Marsh is haunted by secrets. Like the identity of the person who killed her twin sister, Emily, in a hit-and-run accident last Halloween. Like the things Devon said to Emily just before she died. But she's determined to start fresh when she boards a four-hour flight along with her classmates for their senior class ski trip. Devon never could have guessed those secrets would surface in the most terrifying way when a supernatural creature hijacks their flight and gives the students a deadly ultimatum: choose one among them to sacrifice before the end of the flight. If they do not, the plane will crash. As the clock ticks down, the creature slowly unearths the passengers' deepest, darkest secrets--and reveals that one of the teens on the plane is responsible for Emily's death. The students must agree on a sacrifice, or there won't be any survivors. But can Devon find a way to stop the creature, or will she give in to her anger and let revenge take control?

Picoult, Jodi Second Glance

A man's attempt to sell a piece of land and the resulting Abenaki tribe's protest that it is a sacred burial ground spurs an investigation by ghost hunter Ross Wakeman, who discovers a long-hidden murder haunting a small Vermont town.

Plum, Amy Die for Me (and sequels)

After their parents are killed in a car accident, sixteen-year-old Kate Mercier and her older sister Georgia, each grieving in her own way, move to Paris to live with their grandparents. Kate finds herself powerfully drawn to the handsome but elusive Vincent who seems to harbor a mysterious and dangerous secret.

Questell, Jaime By a Charm & a Curse

Emmaline King is ensnared by Le Grand's Carnival Fantastic, a traveling circus bound by a centuries-old curse that dooms its members to participate in an endless, ageless series of performances.

Ribar, Lindsay Rocks Fall, Everyone Dies

A paranormal suspense novel about a seventeen-year-old boy who can reach inside people and steal their innermost things-fears, memories, scars, even love--and his family's secret ritual that for centuries has kept the cliff above their small town from collapsing.

Roberts, Jeyn When They Fade

Brutally murdered in the early 1970s, Molly can fade back to earth for a few fleeting moments as a teenage hitchhiker who can see the future. When Tatum, bullied at school and dumped by her best friend, picks up Molly and hears 'You're going to die. It will hurt and you'll be alone. And no one will help you,' Tatum and Molly must figure out how to help the other in order to save themselves.

Rogerson, Margaret Vespertine

The dead of Loraille do not rest. If the bodies of the deceased are not cleansed so their souls can pass on, they will rise as spirits with a ravenous hunger for the living. When her convent is attacked by possessed soldiers, Artemisia defends it by awakening an ancient spirit bound to a saint's relic. It is a revenant, a malevolent being that threatens to possess her the moment she drops her guard. But Artemisia is desperate and turns to the last remaining expert for help: the revenant itself.

Rueckert, Laura A Dragonbird in the Fern

After the assassination of her older sister Scilla, seventeen-year-old Jiara chooses to take her sister's place as the bride to the young king of a distant country, hoping to identify her sister's killer before Scilla's vengeful ghost murders their family.

Sain, Ginny Dark and Shallow Lies

In a small town deep in the bayou, seventeen-year-old Grey, while searching for answers about the disappearance of her best friend, uncovers long-held secrets that threaten everything she believed about herself, her family, her friends, and her home.

Schmitt, Sarah J. It's a Wonderful Death

Seventeen-year-old RJ always gets what she wants. When her soul is accidentally collected by a distracted Grim Reaper, somebody in the afterlife better figure out a way to send her back from the dead or heads will roll.

Shepard, Sara Wait for Me

As a seventeen-year-old sophomore at NYU, Casey wears different disguises to fit in, but when she starts hearing voices and seeing visions, she travels to a remote beach town and searches for answers.

Shusterman, Neal Bruiser

Inexplicable events start to occur when sixteen-year-old twins Tennyson and Bronte befriend a troubled and misunderstood outcast, aptly nicknamed Bruiser, and his little brother, Cody.

Smith, Cynthia Leitich Harvest House

When strange things start happening at night near a new, supposedly haunted, rural attraction, including a creepy man stalking young Indigenous women, Hughie Wolfe and his friends set out to discover the truth in order to protect themselves and their community.

Smith, Jean F. The Other Side of Infinity

Told from alternating perspectives, when lifeguard Nick hesitates during a save, seventeen-year-old December uses her gift of foreknowledge to help, but she inadvertently sets off a chain of events that puts Nick's life in danger.

Speer, Scott Immortal City (and sequel)

Drawn to the only girl in Angel City who is not obsessed with following the lives of celebrity Angels on television, Jackson Godspeed falls in love with the girl only to be caught in the wake of a serial killer who is murdering angels.

Stiefvater, Maggie Shiver (and sequels)

In all the years she has watched the wolves in the woods behind her house, Grace has been particularly drawn to an unusual yellow-eyed wolf who, in his turn, has been watching her with increasing intensity.

Stokes, Stacy The Darkness Rises

Whitney knows what death looks like. Since she was seven, she's seen it hover over strangers' heads in dark, rippling clouds. Sometimes she can save people from the darkness. Sometimes she can't. But she's never questioned if she should try--until the unthinkable happens, and a person she saves becomes the perpetrator of a horrific school shooting. Now Whitney will do anything to escape the memory of last year's tragedy and the guilt that gnaws at her for her role in it. Even if that means quitting dance--the thing she loves most--and hiding her ability from her family and friends. But most importantly, no one can know what really happened last year. Then Whitney finds an ominous message in her locker and realizes someone knows her secret. As the threats pile up, one thing becomes clear--someone wants payback for what she did. And if she's going to survive the year, she must track down whoever is after her before it's too late.

Stolarz, Laurie Faria Deadly Little Secret (and sequel)

When someone starts stalking high school junior Camelia, everyone at school assumes that it is Ben, who is new at school and rumored to have killed his previous girlfriend, but Camelia is nevertheless inexplicably drawn to him.

Stroud, Jonathan The Screaming Staircase

Three young operatives of the Psychic Detection Agency battle an epidemic of ghosts in London.

Sutherland, Krystal House of Hollow

Iris and Vivi work to uncover their dark, dangerous, and possibly magical past when their older sister Grey goes missing.

Taylor, Devon Dagger Hill

After a mysteriously catastrophic incident shakes up their sleepy hometown, seventeen-year-old best friends Gabe, Kimberly, Charlie, and Sonya discover they are being hunted by a sinister presence.

Taylor, Laini Daughter of Smoke and Bone (and sequels)

Seventeen-year-old Karou, a lovely, enigmatic art student in a Prague boarding school, carries a sketchbook of hideous, frightening monsters--the chimaerae who form the only family she has ever known.

VanderMeer, Jeff A Peculiar Peril

Jonathan Lambshead will inherit his grandfather's mansion-- after he and two schoolmates catalog its contents. They discover that the mansion's basement contains portals—and one of them leads to an alt-Earth called Aurora. Magic abounds there, history has been rewritten, and an occult dictator called Aleister Crowley leads an army pillaging alt-Europe. Jonathan pieces together his destiny as a member of a secret society devoted to keeping our world separate from Aurora. Alliances shift as the trio pursues the profound evil-- and discover it is also chasing them.

Wakefield, Vikki Ballad for a Mad Girl

Seventeen-year-old Grace Foley is a risk-taker, and as part of the long-running feud between two schools, accepts a challenge to walk the pipe. That night she experiences something she can't explain and becomes haunted by voices and visions. She's drawn deeper into a twenty-year-old mystery surrounding missing girl Hannah Holt and can no longer tell what's real or imagined. She is losing herself, and her friends don't understand.

Wealer, Sara Bennett Grave Things Like Love

Elaine's home is a bit . . . different. It's a funeral home that has been in her family since the 1800s--and it's why everyone calls her Funeral Girl. And even though she's lived there her whole life, there are still secrets to be found. When Xander, a cute new boy with a penchant for ghost hunting, arrives in town, Elaine feels an instant spark. His daring and spontaneous ways help her go from Funeral Girl to Fun Girl. Then there's Miles, Elaine's oldest friend, who she's starting to see in a completely new light. After Xander convinces her to stage a seance one night, Elaine discovers that her home might be haunted by a kindred spirit--the daughter of the funeral home's original owner. But who wants to be haunted by the dead when there are boys to spend time with?

West, Hannah The Bitterwine Oath

Can eighteen-year-old Natalie and her great-great-grandmother's magical sisterhood end the cycle of violence in Natalie's small Texas town?

White, Kiersten Paranormalcy (and sequels)

When a dark prophecy begins to come true, sixteen-year-old Evie of the International Paranormal Containment Agency must not only try to stop it, she must also uncover its connection to herself and the alluring shapeshifter, Lend.

Wooten, Jeff Kill Call

Dreams do come true. It's Jude's job to make sure they don't. Born with the curse of prophetic nightmares, Jude sees violent murders through the eyes of the killer before they happen. His father, who shares Jude's dark gift, has trained Jude to save the innocent and to kill the killer. A life for a life--it's the only way. But everything goes awry when Hanna Smith, the young woman he was supposed to save, rescues herself instead, and catches Jude in her home. Fate isn't inescapable, but it demands balance. While Hanna may be safe for now, Jude knows that the killer will strike again, only next time there will be no warning. Jude must now find the killer, without the visions to aid him. If he fails, he and Hanna will not live to see graduation.

Zappia, Francesca Now Entering Addamsville

Someone burns down the home of the school janitor and he dies in the blaze. Everyone in Addamsville, Indiana, points a finger at Zora Novak, despite the fact she has been on the straight and narrow since her father was thrown in jail. Addamsville has a history of tragedy, and thirty years ago a similar string of fires left several townspeople dead. The arsonist was never caught. Teaming up with her cousin Artemis, an annoying self-proclaimed Addamsville historian, Zora must deal with a popular ghost-hunting television show riling up the townspeople, almost no support from her family and friends, and rumors spinning out of control. Getting people to believe the truth might prove to be impossible.

Zargarpur, Deeba House of Yesterday

Struggling with her parent's divorce and her grandmother's dementia, fifteen-year-old Sarah Khan tries to distract herself in a home renovation project--but instead finds the house is full of dark family secrets that give rise to ghostly apparitions.
