Bracken, Alexandra Passenger (and sequel)

When a violin prodigy who has lost everything wakes up on a ship in another time period, a man who wants to escape a life of servitude is forced to confront his past while keeping his former captors from claiming a stolen object of untold value.

Briggs, Elizabeth Future Shock (and sequel)

Elena, nearly aged out of the foster care system, is recruited along with four other exceptional teens for a time-travel mission that will make them rich—if they survive.

Butler, Octavia Kindred

Dana, a black woman, finds herself repeatedly transported to the antebellum South where she must make sure that Rufus, the plantation owner's son, survives to father Dana's ancestor.

Carr, Shelly Dickson Ripped: A Jack the Ripper Time-Travel Thriller

Katie Lennox wishes her parents were still alive. Having to leave Boston to live with Grandma Cleaves in London was hard, but she's making new friends, working on her British accent, and even learning some Cockney rhyming slang. London actually feels like home in some ways, like she's been here before, belongs here. When a museum visit with her cousin and his cute friend turns funky, Katie finds herself in a long, uncomfortable dress, wearing a ridiculous hat, wondering what happened to her jeans and high-top sneakers? Davies, Linda Longbow Girl

Sixteen-year-old expert archer Merry Owen is desperate to save her family's farm in Wales in the shadow of the Black Castle. When she finds a buried chest containing an ancient Welsh text, she hopes it will be the key to a fortune--and so it is, but not in the way she expected when it sends her and her friend James de Courcy into past.

Destefano, Merrie Valiant

The Valiant was supposed to save us. Instead, it triggered the end of the world. Earth is in shambles. Everyone, even the poorest among us, invested in the Valiant's space mining mission in the hopes we'd be saved from ourselves. But the second the ship leaves Earth's atmosphere, our fate is sealed. The alien invasion begins. They pour into cities around the world through time portals, possessing humans, forcing us to kill one another. And for whatever reason, my brother is their number one target. Now the fate of the world lies in the hands of me, a seventeen-year-old girl, but with the help of my best friend, Justin--who's suddenly starting to feel like more--maybe if we save my brother, we can save us all . . .

Doyle, Sir Arthur Conan The Lost World

When four Englishmen venture into the prehistoric remote plateau of the South American jungle, they must rely on their cunning and superior intellect to escape from a band of pre-human ape-men.

Ernshaw, Shea Winterwood

Nora Walker, a high schooler who comes from a long line of witches, is feared by everyone in her community, including those at the Camp for Wayward Boys, located across the lake from the Walkers' ancestral home. After one of the boys, Oliver, goes missing during a deadly snowstorm that seals off their area, Nora finds him lost in the haunted Wicker Woods with no recollection of how he survived alone in the freezing woods for two long weeks. When another boy dies by drowning, Nora is determined to unravel who is responsible for the disappearances, though her feelings for Oliver cloud her judgment and the truth.

Fadugba, Femi The Upper World

Yesterday. Esso has a gift for being in the wrong place at the wrong time. It's just landed him in the middle of a deadly conflict between two rival South London gangs. All he wants is to make it through Friday alive. but then an accident knocks him into a place beyond space or time; a world where he can see glimpses of his past and future. And if what he sees there is true, he and his friends don't have much longer to live, unless he can change the course of history. Tomorrow. Rhia has nothing but questions about her past, and she wouldn't have expected her new physics tutor to have the answers. But Dr. Esso isn't here to make sure Rhia does her homework. Gier, Kerstin Ruby Red (and sequels)

Gwyneth Shepherd's sophisticated, beautiful cousin Charlotte has been prepared her entire life for traveling through time. But unexpectedly it is Gwyneth who, in the middle of class, takes a sudden spin to a different era! Gwyneth must now unearth the mystery of why her mother would lie about her birth date to ward off suspicion about her ability, brush up on her history, and work with Gideon--the time traveler from a similarly gifted family that passes the gene through its male line and whose presence becomes, in time, less insufferable and more essential. Together Gwyneth and Gideon journey through time to discover who, in the 18th century and in contemporary London, they can trust.

Jones, Gareth P. No True Echo

Teenaged Eddie meets a new girl who is a Senior Echo Time Agent from the future, come to his town to investigate the origin of time travel. Soon Eddie is swept up in the investigation and in time. But time travel is a dangerous business, and Eddie will learn more than he wants to know about his long-dead mother.

Kaye, Jessica Beyond the Wall

When Daxia dreamed of questing beyond The Wall, she never imagined her sister's life would be on the line. Now she must travel to a faraway island and find the cure for her sister's fatal illness.

King, Stephen The Gunslinger (and sequels)

*I*st book in Dark Tower series. Roland, the world's last gunslinger, tracks an enigmatic Man in Black toward a forbidding dark tower fighting forces both mortal and other-worldly on his quest.

Kurland, Lynn When I Fall in Love

While on vacation in England, Jennifer McKinnon wakes up eight hundred years into the past where she discovers that chivalry is alive and well when a handsome knight comes to her rescue and vows to help her return home.

Lauer, Amanda Royal & Ancient

Bronwyn Campbell's end-of-summer plans were simple: wrap up her job at Saint Andrews Country Club, meet her friends one last time at the virtual reality arcade, and move across the country--again--with her father. But when lightning strikes while she's working the club's Saint Andrews Heritage Day, she's transported from an American fairway to the home of golf, The Links at St. Andrews, in Scotland--and in the year 1691, no less. When Iain MacDonald discovers Bronwyn knocked out cold on the seventeenth green, little does he know their meeting will change not only the course of their lives but the course of history. The son of the chieftain of Clan MacDonald, Iain bears the weight of responsibility for his family and his clan's survival on his shoulders. Everyone in Jenny's life has spent the last twenty-five years mourning her death. Jenny has missed two decades of pop culture, and her high school is practically unrecognizable. Noel, Alyson Stealing Infinity (and sequel)

Now I've been kicked out of high school, arrested, and accepted into a remote, off-the-grid school owned and operated by an inscrutable billionaire tech guru. Gray Wolf Academy is looking for a certain kind of student—someone like me that no one will miss. Then there's Braxton. He's a total enigma-which means that I definitely can't trust him, even if there's something about him that makes me want to. They all tell me I have a gift—a very rare gift. And Gray Wolf Academy wants me to learn it—to use it. If what they say is true, I have all the time in the world. And that makes me the most dangerous high school student you'll never know . . .

O'Doherty, Carolyn Rewind (and sequel)

In a world where spinners can freeze and rewind time but are tightly controlled by the government, sixteen-year-old Alex is a spinner paired with Agent Ross to help catch a dangerous criminal.

Reynolds, Justin A. Opposite of Always

When Jack and Kate meet at a party, Jack knows he's falling—hard. But then Kate dies. And their story should end there. Yet Kate's death sends Jack back to the beginning, the moment they first meet, and Kate's there again. Jack isn't sure if he's losing his mind. Still, if he has a chance to prevent Kate's death, he'll take it—even if that means believing in time travel. However, Jack will learn that his actions are not without consequences.

Sedgwick, Marcus Midwinterblood

Seven linked vignettes unfold on a Scandinavian island inhabited--throughout various time periods--by Vikings, vampires, ghosts, and a curiously powerful plant.

Selfors, Suzanne Saving Juliet

Seventeen-year-old Mimi Wallingford's stage fright and fight with her mother on the closing night of Romeo and Juliet are nothing compared to the troubles she faces when she and her leading man are transported to Shakespeare's Verona where she decides to give the real Juliet a happy ending.

Shahnaz, Zeba Midnight Strikes

Seventeen-year-old Anaïs just wants tonight to end. As an outsider at the kingdom's glittering anniversary ball, she has no desire to rub shoulders with the nation's most eligible (and pompous) bachelors--especially not the notoriously roguish Prince Leo. But at the stroke of midnight, an explosion rips through the palace, killing everyone in its path. Including her. The last thing Anaïs sees is fire, smoke, chaos . . . and then she wakes up in her bedroom, hours before the ball. No one else remembers the deadly attack or believes her warnings of disaster. Prof. Alexander Hartdegen travels in his time machine to eighty thousand years in the future where the passive Eloi are held in thrall by the mutants called Morlocks.
